City Inquiry

City Inquiry is a civic and social equity educational program that fosters students' research skills, critical analysis and collaborative learning while developing their independence and initiative.

With the city as their classroom, students explore the CBD, complete multidisciplinary tasks in a real-life context and investigate a contemporary issue.

Camps & Adventures

The Discovery Learning Program is a dynamic element of the College curriculum, and facilitates experiential learning beyond the walls of the traditional classroom.

Outdoor education experiences on residential camps offer a chance for students to take greater responsibility for themselves, connect with nature and each other, explore an unfamiliar environment and learn hands-on skills.

NaviGate

Year 9 students are inspired to step out of their comfort zone, open the 'gate' and explore new ideas and possibilities whilst developing enterprising skills, collaborating in teams and embracing physical challenges.

World Study Tours

Opportunities include international language and cultural study tours, sustainable community project expeditions to developing countries and an indigenous immersion tour to Central Australia.

International trip itineraries are carefully constructed to enable students to further develop as a socially responsible global citizen, gain a better understanding of themselves and build connections across borders.

Student Leadership

Leading Lanterns Program

Year 10 students enjoy the opportunity to become mentors to Year 7 students and support their first year in secondary school. The program gives students the chance to build connections and learn how to be positive role models.

Alumnae Influencers Network

Beyond the Charles Street gates is a dynamic network of inspiring women who share a common heritage as Avila Alumnae, having pursued professional pathways across a range of global industries and sectors.

Our Alumnae maintain close ties with the school and each other, often acting as cross generational mentors and regularly return to Avila to share their experiences and advice as influencers in their chosen field.

Digi-Day

Designed to promote female leadership in robotics, Avila College's signature Digi-Day program was developed by a group of teachers from the Science and Mathematics departments.

The inquiry based program teams Year 8 mentors with Grade 4 students. Avila students prepare and deliver sessions on robotics, drones and 3D printing.

Beyond 2040

Designed and developed by Avila College teachers, Beyond 2040 for Year 7 students is a collaborative research and inquiry program. Working in teams, students are challenged to consider what the future could look like if we embraced the best solutions available in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths today.

Industry experts are brought in to share their expertise as students engage deeply in solution-finding and design thinking.

Music

Over the last five years Avila College has managed an intensive construction program and opened three new buildings.

Ballygriffin Senior Learning Centre

The Ballygriffin Senior Learning Centre, named in honour of Nano Nagle's birthplace, is a two storey complex featuring flexible and interactive contemporary spaces for learning and teaching. Ballygriffin has been purposefully designed to cultivate community connections, incorporating numerous common



areas and multi purpose zones where students can collaborate and interact.

Welcome Building and Food Technology

Avila College's state of the art Food Technology facility harnesses the latest in commercial and educational health and safety, equipment and sustainable solutions.

Open and inviting, the Welcome Building and Administration Centre is the main entry point for the school campus.

St Teresa Library

The St Teresa Library is located at the heart of Avila College, serving as a dynamic hub for learning, collaboration, reading and research. Opened at the start of 2026, it offers an additional vibrant and engaging community space at Avila.

Our Heritage.



Founded in 1965, Avila College has a proud tradition of educating girls, fostering intellectual curiosity and empowering students to achieve their own personal best.

Inspired by the spirituality, devotion and mysticism of St Teresa of Avila, the first female Doctor of the Church, the College was named in her honour.

The Presentation Sisters of 1965 brought to life the legacy of Nano Nagle, shining a light on education for girls in a contemporary world.

From an initial enrolment of just 110 students and two full time staff, Avila College has grown tenfold since the first classrooms were built in Charles Street.

Over the decades, the small site has evolved and expanded through continuous development, renewal and refurbishment into a modern, green and technology enabled school campus.

Step One **SCHOOL TOUR**

Visit Avila College, hear from our students, meet the teachers and tour our College campus. Register online for one of our school tour events.

Step Two **APPLICATION**

Submissions by August 2 years prior (Grade 5)

The Application Form is available on the Avila College website.

Complete and submit the form with the relevant documentation and fee. Indicate if Avila College is your first preference.



Step Three **ADMISSION INTERVIEW**

After applications close, we conduct a short interview with each applicant.

This meeting is a chance to get to know each other better and an opportunity for students to ask questions about secondary school, transition and Avila College.



Step Four **OFFER**

Letters of Offer are sent to all successful applicants by the third week of October.

Offers must be completed, signed and returned to Avila College together with the Enrolment Fee and Debenture Deposit by the due date to confirm the place.



Step Five **TRANSITION**


